I am very happy to recall the years 1952-1956, in Jai Hind College (The Basant Sing The Film Institute of India, at Pedder Road, by the newly arrived emigrants, from Sind, following the partition of India. I joined the College when it had already moved to 'A'

Road.

I am especially honoured, to have been asked to write, a brief piece, since in retrospect, my education and training at Jai Hind, turned out to be a transformational point, for the rest of my professional career, which is in the public domain. Firstly I wish to acknowledge, my former Professors and since I belong to an ancient generation, readers may not be familiar with the names. Principal T. M. Advani, was

indeed a visionary and an inspirational leader. The Chemistry faculty was led by Professor Kotwani and his son who taught us Organic Chemistry, Prof. Gursahani , Prof. Keswani, Biology by Prof. Khubchandani (who became Principal, after Prof Advani), Professor Motwani, Prof Tulsyani, Prof Sheriar, Prof Avatramani, Prof Dhige and some others . Without exception, each of them, was an inspiring Guru. Their commitment not only to teach, but also to trigger our thinking process, was transformational. I recall, that at the time, Jai Hind, was usually referred to as a 'Sindhi College', to distinguish it from the Colonial institutions

such as St.Xaviers, Sydenham, Wilson, Elphinstone, and others of that vintage, which were considered, premier institutions,

I alongwith my sister Smt. Pratima Wandreker ( nee. Ganguly), were in the same class, during the four years accompanied by a delightful group of classmates. We also looked forward eagerly, to the Annual day and the once a year picnic. Life was rather simple and happy. Our teachers were not only committed to their profession, but were also very caring towards all of us, while being quietly ambitious to compete and win, through the academic performance, of their students.

SHOULD I TAKE THE VACCINE

On Dec 19, 2020 I, enthusiastically received the first dose of the vaccine

No not all, I let science and the facts shared by the experts, guide my eager decision to take it . The vaccines being offered by our state and health care authorities are safe and have gone through a rigorous process of testing including Phase 3 trials that involve tens of thousands of people, consisting of diverse groups of the populations. Yes, the process of approval has been

against COVID 19. As physician anesthesiologists, we perform procedures and interventions which involve a high risk of exposure to Corona virus (aerosol generating procedures). We were thus included in the first round of health care personnel vaccinations in our organization and medical center. At the time of writing this, Pfizer and Moderna vaccines are approved in the US. Sharing some thoughts:

Dr Neeti Sajnani a top notch physician from the US shares her experience on taking the Corona vaccine in the first few days of

expedited but only after careful analysis of data by scientific experts. In any industry a project can be expedited with process improvement and investment of resources to yield a high quality product, without cutting corners. This data shows the vaccines approved for use so far in US are safe and about 95% effective. What motivated me to take the vaccine?

I cannot get COVID from the vaccine. The mRNA does not integrate into my genetic material and does not stay in my body. There is no live virus in the vaccine. The risks of death and long term sequelae of COVID 19 are greater than the observed side effects of vaccine. The vaccine protects the person getting vaccinated. It will prevent severe disease even if I was to get infected

No I did not after the first dose. Mild soreness at the injection site lasted about 24 hours. The common expected side effects are fever, fatigue, headache, chills, muscle pains, joint pains. They could occur in the first 24-36 hours, may last 12-24 hours. These effects show that the vaccine is stimulating our immune system. Those with an allergy to any ingredient of the vaccine or history of severe allergic reactions to injectable medications should discuss this with their physician and in these cases the vaccine may not be indicated. Immunocompromised patients can receive the vaccine after a discussion with their physician, as data is not

If you are skeptical about getting the vaccine:

Prof. Khurshed Cavasji Sheriar was the son of late Dhunmai and Cavasji; beloved husband of Late Soonu, darling farther of Nozer/Ruby, Firooza /Phiroze and Mahrookh/Rumy; much loved grandfather of Zubin/Amy, Shireen/Pervez, Sanaya, Zenia, Natasha and Taroonish and adored great grandfather of Xerxes, Zal and Yazad. After completing his matriculation from his home town - Udwada, he came to Bombay and completed his Bachelor's degree from the then renowned Elphinstone College. In 1947, he joined the Institute of Science where he completed his Masters. In 1950, he joined Jai Hind College, which at that point of time was functioning from a beautiful Bungalow at Peddar Road, as their new building was under construction at Churchgate. It is also where he met the love of He was totally responsible for setting up the Biology Department in the new building. In 1952, his dear friend and colleague Nader Modi (a Lawyer and Lecturer of English) and they along with some friends started The

YCZA (Young Collegians Zoroastrian Association) for Parsee students at Jai Hind College where they gave their books to their juniors and started a trend of passing on the books so that their use was optimized. Later this facility was extended to other colleges -it became Inter-collegiate which culminated into a glorious entity - "The YCZA Book Fund where students independent of cast, creed, financial background could avail of the books not only of the graduate courses but even medicine, engineering and chartered accountancy at a nominal cost (sometimes even free to economically weak students), the only condition being that they be returned In 1954, he was selected to undergo training as an NCC Officer and at the end of his training was commissioned as the 2nd Lieutenant.After 20 years, he retired as a Major, a rank which was held by just a few Officers in whole of India. At Jai Hind College, he served from Initially as a Lecturer - (1951-1961), then as Professor - (1961-1974), later as Head of the Department of Biology - (1974-1987), Senior Vice - Principal (1976-1987), Acting Principal - (1986-1987) and last but not the least Professor Emeritus (1987-1989). He retired after a
